FROM THE DESK OF THE REGIMENTAL SECRETARY BCR PERPETUATED WWI CEF BATTALIONS COMMEMORATION PARADE PACIFIC NATIONAL EXHIBITION 21 SEPTEMBER 2024



On a beautiful last day of summer morning, the Regimental Family remembered the service and sacrifice of the members of its Great War Battalions at the 29th Battalion (Vancouver Regiment) CEF Memorial located in front of the Pacific Coliseum at the PNE.





Our Cadet Corps and CIC Officers were well turned out and in record numbers with over 135 Cadets, including Parade C/RSM, C/CWO Yue (2381 BCR) and many CIC Officers. Thank you to the 2ICs of the BCR Cadet Corps for their good work while all Cadet Commanding Officers were attending an out of town conference. In addition to the large turnout of the Regimental Family, there was also a very large contingent of spectators and parents on site during the parade. A Candle of Remembrance was placed at the foot of the Memorial.







The President of the Regimental Association, Lieutenant-Colonel (Ret'd) Jim Barrett, acted as the Master of Ceremonies and Parade Marshall and provided the attendees with the historical significance of the PNE during WWI and the many CEF Battalions the Regiment perpetuates.



The Regimental Association Padre, The Reverend Gordon Barrett, delivered a very moving service of commemoration and remembrance. The Last Post was played by BCR Bugle Major Chris Ahern, followed by a minute's silence and Rouse.



Memorial Wreaths were laid at the foot of the Memorial by the BCR Honoraries, Honorary Colonel Farid Rohani and Honorary Lieutenant-Colonel Bill Diamond, on behalf of the Regiment, by Vice-President Scott Hamilton and Director Graydon Young, on behalf of the Regimental Association and Major (Ret'd) Roger Prouse and Cpl (Ret'd) Don McGovern, on behalf of the BCR Perpetuated Battalions (7th, 29th and 102nd CEF Battalions).



The Parade concluded with a March Past by the Cadets with Honorary Colonel Rohani taking the salute.



At the conclusion of the Parade, a reception was held for all attendees complete with Subway sandwiches, cookies, Tim Horton's donuts, fruit drinks, coffee and water, compliments of the Regimental Association and served by Louise Prouse, Gayle Hawthorne, Adrienne Wong, MCpl (Ret'd) Chuck Davey and many other helpful Regimental Family volunteers, including CIC Officers and Honorary Lieutenant-Colonel Diamond.

"Walking shoulder to shoulder" young and old gathered for the 7th annual "Canadian Walk for Veterans" in White Rock.





And for the keeners, onward to the eastern end of the boardwalk and back to Memorial Park for the full 5 km circuit.





As announced by CWFV, "net funds raised through the White Rock Canadian Walk for Veterans will help support Veterans across Canada on their recovery journey. The 2024 Challenge Coin, received by all registrants, features "True Patriot Love, Canadian Walk for Veterans" in keeping with the "new parent organization" role adopted by True Patriot Love, On the reverse side of the coin is the inscription "You Make It Happen". Moving forward True Patriot Love will become the lead organizer of the Canadian Walk for Veterans, working in collaboration with the team formerly known as One Veteran Society.






Post "Walk" festivities included a BBQ and refreshments compliments of the Knights of Columbus, White Rock Council #7015.



THE FORGOTTEN

A Novel of the Korean War By: Robert W. Mackay

The Forgotten provides the reader with an exceptional and accurate experience of the uncertainties of war and of its impact on the individual soldier, all seen through the eyes of the volunteer soldier, Corporal Charlie Black, Special Forces, 2nd Battalion, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, during the Battle of Kapyong. Although vastly outnumbered and outgunned, the Patricias halted the advance of a determined Division of the Chinese Liberation Army of the People's Republic of China to the capital of Seoul. 2 PPCLI was subsequently awarded the US Presidential Citation for the action. The author has successfully developed an exceptionally informative, factual and readable narrative from Charlie's joining the Regiment, his training in Wainwright, leaving home, a very complex and stressful trip to Seattle for embarkation via ship to Pusan and the ultimate engagement with the enemy. **The Forgotten** is not only essential reading from an historical perspective, but is also a primer for a better understanding of a soldier's complex life in the field: i.e. not only the traumatic experience of combat, but also the complicated interpersonal relationships with other soldiers; the constant focus on preparedness; the unique manner of communication and humour, the effect of the support of the war effort at home (or lack thereof); and the impact of those back home always with them. All very well done indeed!

We will remember their dedicated service, sacrifice and commitment. Ted Hawthorne,

CLASSES OF MEMBERSHIP

Ordinary Member:

- (a) Any person who has served with The British Columbia Regiment (DCO) RCAC and/or the units it perpetuates, namely the 28th Canadian Armoured Regiment (The British Columbia Regiment) CAC; 6th DCOR; Irish Fusiliers (Vancouver Regiment) and who has received a discharge shall be entitled to apply to become an Ordinary Member and any person who is an Honorary Officer in the Regiment shall be entitled to apply to become an Ordinary Member.
- (b) Any person who has served with an affiliated Cadet Corps for a minimum of two (2) years and who has attained the age of nineteen (19) years shall be entitled to apply to become an Ordinary Member; and
- (c) An Ordinary Member shall be entitled to one (1) vote at all meetings of the members of the Society.

Associate Member:

(a) Any person who is serving or has served with any component of the Canadian Armed Forces shall be entitled to apply to become an Associate Member and any person who is serving or who has served in

the British Commonwealth of Nations Forces and any Allied Forces shall be entitled to apply to become an Associate Member.

- (b) Any member of the family of an Ordinary Member shall be entitled to apply to become an Associate Member; and
- (c) An Associate Member shall be entitled to one (1) vote at all meetings of the members of the Society.

Honorary Member:

- (a) Any person who has rendered special service to the Society, as may be determined by the Board of Directors, may become an Honorary Member.
- (b) Membership dues are not payable by an Honorary Member; and
- (c) An Honorary Member shall be entitled to one (1) vote at all meetings of the members of the Society.

Life Member:

- (a) Any Ordinary Member or Associate Member who has rendered extra special service to the Society, as may be determined by the Board of Directors, may become a Life Member.
- (b) Membership dues are not payable by a Life Member; and
